RE: Missouri London Consortium

We have recently joined with some other colleges to form the Missouri London Consortium, which is a member of the Missouri London Program. The colleges that are part of the consortium are: Central Methodist College, Culver-Stockton College, Hannibal-LaGrange College, Missouri Valley College, and William Woods University. The other members of the Missouri London Program are Truman State, Central Missouri State, Northwest Missouri State, Southeast Missouri State, and the University of Missouri system. Whereas the public university members each send a faculty member to London at least once a year, the members of the Missouri London Consortium will pool their faculty resources to send someone to the London Program on a rotating basis with each school contributing a teacher about once every three years. Our students will be able to attend the London Program in any semester beginning with the fall 2004 semester. Our faculty member will be paid his/her regular salary plus a living expense stipend of at least \$5,000.00. In return for that we ask the faculty member to teach two courses to the Missouri students in London, to participate in the British Life and Culture Course, to help us recruit before and after the appointed semester, and to participate in England in field trips and social events with the students. On the opposite side of this letter is listed the curriculum priority.

If you would like to be considered for an appointment for the academic year **2005-2006**, please contact the Academic Affairs Office for an application. Completed applications must be received in this office by **Wednesday, March 17, 2004**. Only faculty members with terminal degrees (Ph.D. or Ed.D.) are eligible to apply. I will review applications from this campus and forward my recommendations to the Missouri London Consortium directors for their consideration. The directors will review the available faculty and determine curriculum in late March 2004. Letters of appointment will be issued at that time.

I will be happy to discuss this program with anyone interested in applying.

COURSES PROPOSED: Each faculty member will normally carry three assignments while in London. Normally that will be 2 courses and active participation in conducting the British Life and Culture course. Courses with extensive prerequisites do not reflect the philosophy of the Missouri London Program.

CORE CURRICULUM: MOCON seeks to offer a core curriculum each semester. Appointments with top priority are: **English literature/theatre; art history/music appreciation; history/political science; business/economics; communications/media**. Appointments with some priority are: **anthropology/sociology/geography; psychology; religious studies/philosophy**. Other applications might be given consideration.
